Financial Aid Fast Facts

Cost of Attendance

The Cost of Attendance (COA) is the Office of Student Financial Aid Services' estimate of your educational expenses for the academic year. The total Cost of Attendance (COA) includes estimated direct educational costs and an estimate of indirect costs based on full-time attendance in the School of Medicine and Dental Medicine.

Types of Aid

Students at UConn Health can apply for the Federal Direct Loan Program, Institutional Aid, and Scholarships. As a first step to be considered for these programs, students must submit the annual Free Application for Federal Student Aid "**FAFSA**", made available to the public on October 1 every year. To complete a FAFSA, please go to studentaid.gov.

UConn's federal school code is **001417**.

To be considered for institutional aid, students must complete the FAFSA **and** the institutional aid application, every year. Priority filing deadline is **February 15th**. The institutional aid application is located on our website: health.uconn.edu/financial-aid.

Federal aid options include:

- Federal direct unsubsidized loan
- HEAL or Health Loan
- Graduate PLUS Loan
- Federal HRSA Loan(s)

Institutional aid options include:

- Tuition remission (grant funds)
- Institutional loans

Students will be notified via email once their financial aid offerings are available for review in the Student Administration System; studentadmin.uconn.edu. Students can view, acknowledge, and accept their financial aid offerings directly in the portal. Next steps will be listed in the Action Items Tile, under "To – Do List" tab.

Aid is typically disbursed after the beginning of each term (fall, spring or summer). If aid is in excess of the direct charges (tuition and fees) a refund will be issued via direct deposit or mailed to the address on file, by the Office of the Bursar.
